## Course Overview

The BTEC Travel and Tourism course is a practical, work related option. You learn by completing projects and assignments that are based on realistic workplace situations, activities and demands. As well as learning about employment area you have chosen, you develop the skills you need to start a career.

The applied purpose will also enable learners to learn in such a way that they develop:

- skills required for independent learning and development;
- a range of generic and transferable skills;
- the ability to solve problems;
- the skills of project based research, development and presentation;
- the fundamental ability to work alongside other professionals;
- the ability to apply learning in vocational contexts.

Throughout the course you will be encouraged to develop your research and analytical skills through written assignments and coursework.

## How this course will be assessed:

**Level 2** - Students will complete 8 Units, 6 of which are coursework based and 2 is externally examined.

**Level 3** - Students complete 6 Units which are all coursework based. They are no exams for this course currently but there are plans to introduce one exam instead of one unit at a later date.

## What next?

Students go into careers such as: Events Management, Corporate Hospitality, Travel and Tourism Management and Teaching.
