Course Overview

If Art and Design is a subject which interests you and you would like to study it further, this one year course will help you develop your creative skills and gain a qualification which is worth 2 GCSEs Grade A*-C.

If you wish to do the course, you should have a strong interest in Art and Design with good basic art skills. The standard of your work should be a Merit and above. If you did not take art at GCSE you could still do the course if your skills are good enough.

This course concentrates on Art and Design applied to everyday situations; designing publicity material, making sculpture which could be sold commercially, designing artefacts for a market etc. You will do some expressive art too, but most of your time will be spent learning how to apply your creative skills.

How this course will be assessed:

The course itself is made up of 5 units. The WJEC certificate in Creative & Media consists of three internally set units including 2D, 3D and Arts and Crafts; and two externally set units, one creative task and one written exam.

What Next?

If you wish to further your studies, you might decide to study art at AVCE or AS/A level. This is a stepping-stone to studying a HND or Degree in a specialised art subject at a college of further/higher education or university. Courses that you can follow at this higher level include Textile Design, Computer Animation, Ceramics, Jewellery, Graphic Design, Product Design etc.

After completing the WJEC Level 1/2 course in Creative & Media, you might want to look for a job that requires good art skills in industries such as a printing works, publicity design or pottery. Or you could go on to gain specialised qualifications for your chosen career, such as interior design.
